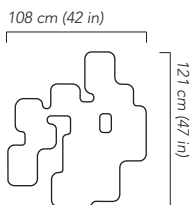




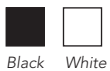

The concept

The influence for **Lucio** is drawn from modernizing the ancient design of an altarpiece, awash in a sacred glow. **Lucio** emits a beautiful light source, creating a warm and comfortable atmosphere. The subtle light bounces from the wall, while also reflecting from the frames of its 12 mirrors. The combination produces the perfect setting as you enjoy your own private sanctuary of light and modern design.

Light source

Lucio is powered by 220 small, white LEDs on the rear side, concealed behind a white plastic backing. The LED lights consume as little as 40 watts and span a lifetime of over 30,000 hours.

Lucio was exhibited at SaloneSatellite in 2007 and was ranked among the top 10 pieces, as selected by the curator, Marva Griffin-Wilshire, for *Metropolis* magazine (April 2007). Marva Griffin-Wilshire is a member of the board of Architecture and Design at MoMA in New York.

Available in two colors: Black and White. Designed and produced in Iceland. Open edition; labeled with its number and production year. **Lucio** is easily mounted on a wall. Mirrors and LED's are replaceable.

Siggi Anton is a Scandinavian designer based in Reykjavik, Iceland.
